

# MISSIONS DINNER REQUIRMENTS

Here are a few guidelines to inform you on the mission dinners.

- 1.) They are an absolute privilege. We are blessed to be able to have a fundraiser of this magnitude for you and your student. Student's who participate fully, fulfilling all of the requirements, will get an equal share in the amount raised.
- 2.) We do expect our missions students to attend main service on the day of the dinner. It reflects poorly upon our missions students when they work the missions dinner without being seen in the main sanctuary. It makes a great statement when the youth section is full during the first service.
- 3.) Every student, together with one parent, is required to be at the dinner and set up. If you have more than one student on the trip one parent is acceptable. But we graciously welcome a second parent!
- 4.) **Each student is responsible to bring a dessert that can feed 30 individuals (i.e. pineapple upside down cake, chocolate cake, tarts).**
- 5.) The students will be responsible to serve and clean off the tables, and the parents will help in the kitchen or on the main floor.
- 6.) In order to receive full profit, the student must fulfill the following criteria:

**50% - Being present for setup, serving, *and* cleanup**

**25% - Bringing dessert**

**25% - One parent is present to help**

- 7.) The dress for this event is black pants and white tops.

\*\*We automatically assume that you will be participating in all of the missions dinners. To plan ahead, we must know who will be present. If you are unable to make a setup, or a dinner **please let Hannah know NOW or at least by the practice before.** If circumstances are beyond your control you may get another family member to help you.
